

Exciting New Grant: Improving Hypertension Control at El Rio Health

We're thrilled to announce that **Dr. Daniel J. Smith, Associate Professor,** from the **Department of Public Health,** has been awarded a grant as the primary investigator for an innovative community health project that aligns with ATSU's strategic focus on improving community health research outcomes. We're excited to see the results of this important work and its potential to make a real difference in community health.

Project Highlights:

- Title: "A Retrospective Data Analysis of Pre and Post Home Blood Pressure Monitoring Device Prescriptions and Other Blood Pressure Control Strategies at El Rio Health"
- Funding: ATSU Community Health Workgroup Quality Improvement & Research Pilot Project Grant
- Amount: \$9,000

 Potential Impact: This research has the potential to inform best practices for hypertension control in community health centers across the country, ultimately improving cardiovascular health outcomes for underserved populations.

- El Rio Health of Tucson, Arizona: Dr. Lisa Soltani, Dr. Erin Dougherty, Grace Parker, MPH Project Overview:

This study aims to explore the effectiveness of home blood pressure monitors and other strategies in controlling hypertension among patients at El Rio Health, a community health center. The research builds on El Rio's successful initiative that increased blood pressure control rates from 45% to an impressive 75% over three years. The team will analyze three years of data to determine which strategies were most effective in improving blood pressure control. There will also be qualitative interviews for a comprehensive understanding of the effectiveness of interventions.
